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Preface

Picture CROW is a crossword puzzle booklet designed for children who have been learning English for at least 1 or 2 years and have already gained a basic knowledge. However, we also recommend it for anybody who is seeking a playful way of learning English.

The puzzles are based mostly on those frequently used words in English that everybody needs to know. Because the booklet contains only drawings as clues, they stand only for common expressions used in everyday life, avoiding collocations, phrases and idioms that would be hard to recognize from pictures.

Notations:

B B (beginning) means that you have to write the *first* 1, 2 or 3 letters of the answer in the squares provided.

E E (end) means that you have to write the *last* 1, 2 or 3 letters of the answer in the squares provided.

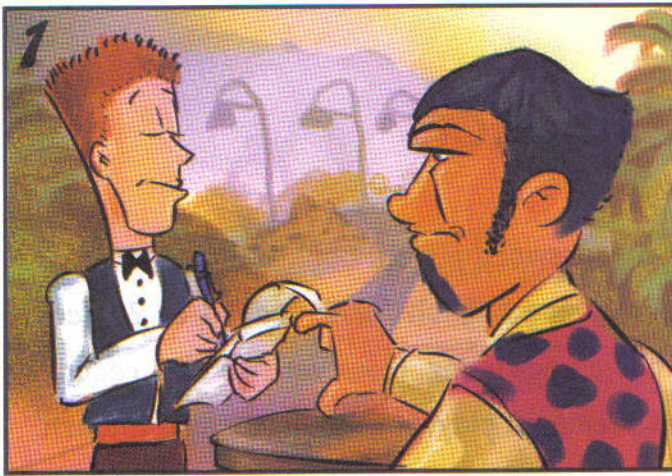
K.V. given letters: here the answer is *KV* as in the clue



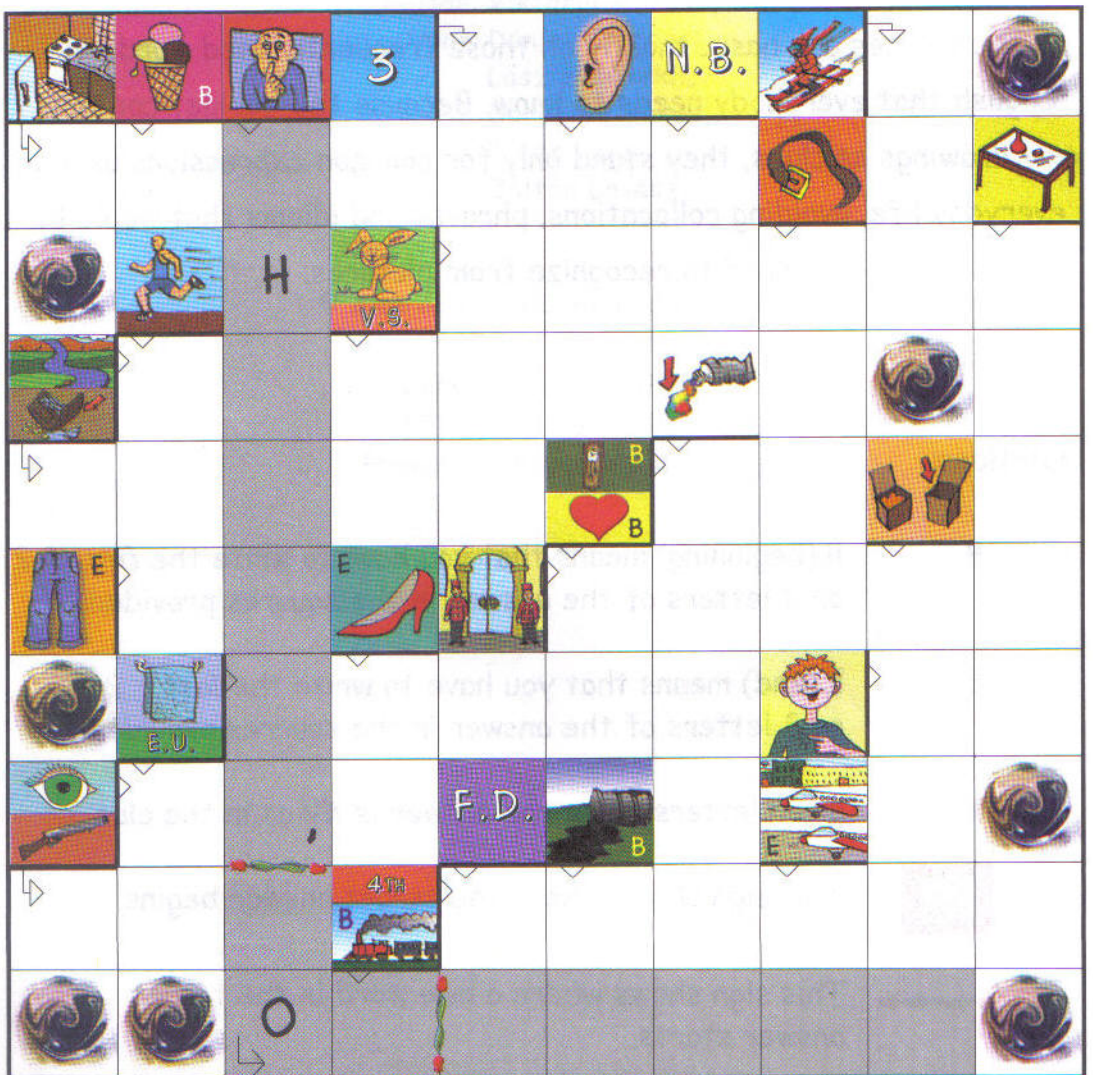
This sign shows where the target answer begins.
